SUMMARY: The document below records the Queen's gift of plate at the christening of Oxford's daughter, Elizabeth Vere, born 2 July 1575. According to Lord Burghley's notes, the christening took place on 10 July 1575.

Other entries in the folio have not been transcribed.

Gifts given by her said Majesty and delivered at sundry times in manner and form following, that is to say:

Th' Earl of Oxford's daughter

Item, more given by her said Majesty and delivered the 14<sup>th</sup> of July Anno pred{icto} at the christening of the Earl of Oxford's daughter, one basin and a lane [=sic for 'lame'] gilt poz [=weighing] Ciiij oz di q{ua}rt{er}, and one standing cup gilt with a cover of Flanders making poz liij oz di, both bought of the said Robert Brandon, in toto Clvij oz di di q{ua}rt{er}
