SUMMARY: The document below is a copy of a warrant dated 30 June 1604 from William Stanley (1561 – 29 September 1642), 6th Earl of Derby, to Hugh Glasiour, authorizing payment of all future profits of his office of Chamberlain of the County Palatine of Chester to be paid to his wife, Oxford's daughter, Elizabeth de Vere (1575-1627).

Whereas I have given and freely bestowed upon my well-beloved wife, Elizabeth, Countess of Derby, for and in augmentation of her present living and maintenance the full moiety and one half of all such issues, profits, fees & commodities which shall yearly become and grow due unto me by reason of my office of Chamberlain of the County Palatine of Chester out of and from the Court of Exchequer there;

These are therefore to will & require you that you do cause the [-the] said moiety of all the said profits to be duly and truly answered and paid yearly from henceforth to the hands of my said wife or to such other person or persons as she shall authorize to receive the same:

And this my warrant irrevocable shall be a sufficient discharge unto you in that behalf;

In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal the 30^{th} day of June Anno R{egnorum} Iacobi Anglie ij et Scocie xxxvij.
