

SUMMARY: This document itemizes the payment schedule for Oxford's original debt to the Court of Wards of £3306, that is, £2000 for wardship payable at the rate of £200 per year from 10 May 1572 to 10 May 1581; £48 19s 9-1/4d for mean rates payable in 1571; £1257 for livery payable at the rate of £57 18s 3/4d on All Saints Day 1571 and thereafter £100 per year on All Saints day until 1583. The legality of the Queen's imposition of a £2000 fine for wardship on Oxford after he had reached the age of majority is questionable.

THE WHOLE FINE for the wardship of the right honourable Edward, Earl of Oxenford, was stalled to be paid by ten obligations of £200 apiece, due as followeth, viz.,
