SUMMARY: The document below summarizes a letter written in January 1576(?) from Hampton Court by Eleanor Bridges to Edward Manners (1549–1587), 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl of Rutland. Eleanor Bridges, one of the Queen's Maids of Honour, was the daughter of Edmund Brydges (d.1573), 2<sup>nd</sup> Baron Chandos, and Dorothy (1529/30–1605), fifth daughter and coheir of Edmund, 1<sup>st</sup> Baron Bray. The letter announces that Oxford's sister, Mary de Vere (d.1624), has been sworn of the Privy Chamber.

The Queen has used Mary Shelton very ill for her marriage. She hath dealt(?) liberal both with blows and evil words, and hath not yet granted her consent. No one ever bought her husband more dearly. Lady Mary de Vere, sister of the Earl of Oxford, is sworn one of the Privy Chamber. The Court is as full of malice and spite as when you left.
