SUMMARY: The document below is description in the Augmentations Office Miscellaneous Book of premises which were leased to Sir William Kingston by indenture dated 6 May 1540. For the indenture, see TNA E 315/212, ff. 134-5.

LM: Parcel of the lands & possessions of the late priory of the Blackfriars within the city of London, that is to say:

First the inner cloister, now a garden, & the lodging underneath the dorter with the hall, buttery and cellar on the north part, and the library lying on the east side of the same cloister, with also the part of the dorter not assigned to my Lady Anne Grey lying on the north side of the same cloister, together with the room beneath within the same cloister, and also the fermery lying at the west end of the said cloister, with the rooms & places above and beneath to the same belonging, together with the bakehouse & brewhouse adjoining to the same fermery, & a stable lying next to the said brewhouse, with all ways entries and goings into and from the same, rented and extended to the yearly value of 60s.
