SUMMARY: This document records the receipt by William Cooke of sums of money received by him to Oxford's use from Henry Golding, William Bugby, and Jerome Balborough, bailiffs of Oxford's manors, from the farmer of the manor of Abington, and from Robert Newdigate, feodary of Buckinghamshire, in 1564 and 1565.
