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Lands and possessions of the late right honourable man, John de Vere, Earl of Oxenford, deceased, in divers counties of England.

Accounts of all and singular the honours, castles, lordships, manors, lands, tenements, and the rest of the hereditaments whatsoever which late have been of the foresaid John de Vere, late Earl of Oxenford, now being in the hands of the Lady Queen, so by or after the death of the same late Earl as by reason of the minor age of Edward de Vere, now Earl of Oxenford, son & nearest heir & elder male issue of the body of the foresaid John, late Earl of Oxenford, lawfully begotten, viz., from the feast of Saint Michael the Archangel in the fifth year [=September 29, 1563] of the reign of the Lady Elizabeth, by the grace of God of England, France, & Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, etc., until the same feast of Saint Michael the Archangel thereafter next following in the 6th year [=September 29, 1564] of the reign of the same Lady Queen, namely, for one entire year, as appears below.
